All productive areas shown on this map are considered to be within the Trenton Field.

Most well locations on this map have not been field checked. Well locations that have not been field checked are plotted according to information in the files of the Indiana Geological Survey. Miscellaneous maps provided the principal source of information, but individual well records and old publications were also used.

Total well completions in Wells County exceed those shown on this map. Records of many wells drilled probably were never recorded anywhere. In addition, location descriptions for many records on file and in old publications are insufficiently detailed to permit spotting.

As this map is incomplete and contains inaccuracies, it does not meet the normal standards set for the Petroleum Exploration Map series published by the Indiana Geological Survey. Publication is felt to be justified, however, because part of the oil area of the Trenton Field is depicted in greater detail than heretofore.

Note: Reserves are recognized land divisions defined prior to surveys establishing the congressional system. For convenience in description they are assigned to congressional townships; the arbitrary township boundaries are shaded.
